# Before you store:

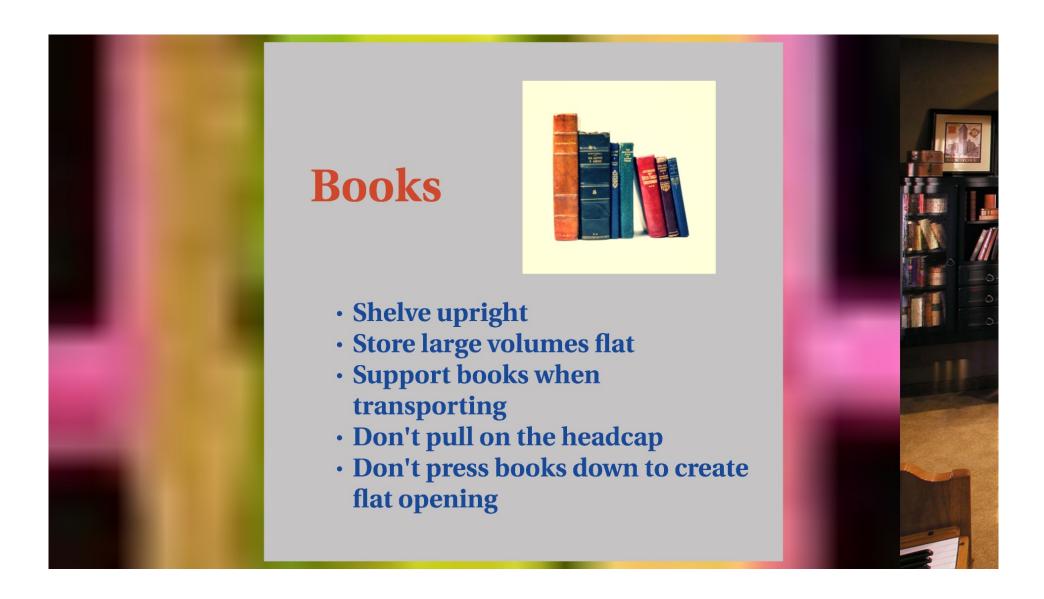
- Avoid pressure-sensitive tape and rubber cement
- Remove all metal fasteners, rubber bands, cardboard, newspaper clippings, and ephemera
- Handle photographs carefully around the edges (with white, cotton gloves, if you have them)
- · Only use pencil
- Don't do anything that can't be undone!





# Before you store:

- Avoid pressure-sensitive tape and rubber cement

### **Photos and Documents**

### **Paper**

- · Unfold items to store
- · Store in acid-free folders
- · Avoid kraft, manila folders/envelopes
- Oversize documents and prints should be stored flat or rolled
- Pros: less expensive, write on it, not static
- · Cons: Requires more handling

#### **Plastic**

- Avoid PVC
- Use Mylar, Polypropylene, or Polyethelene
- Pros: transparent, static
- Cons: Static, holds moisture, hard to identify, more expensive, heavy

Other Options: Acid-free boxes, Metal File Drawers



#### **Photographs**

- · Albums
- Store in archival plastic or acidfree paper
- Store prints and negatives separately!



#### **Negatives**

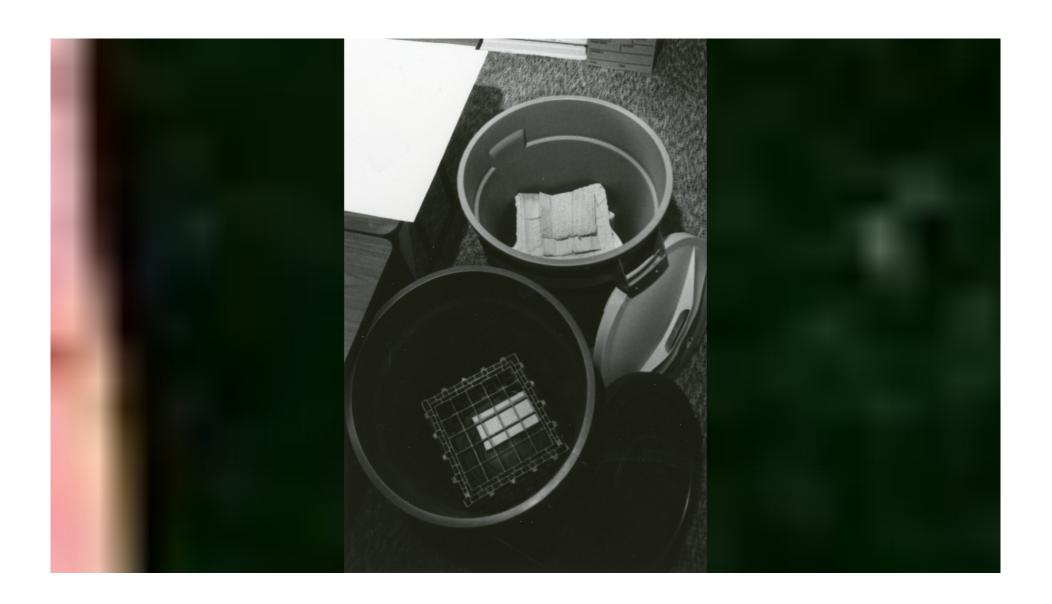


- Store in paper envelope
  - 1 negative per envelope!
- Store in acid-free boxes or powder-coated metal cabinet
- Nitrate and acetate negatives in buffered envelopes, never plastic
- Avoid PVC slide pages

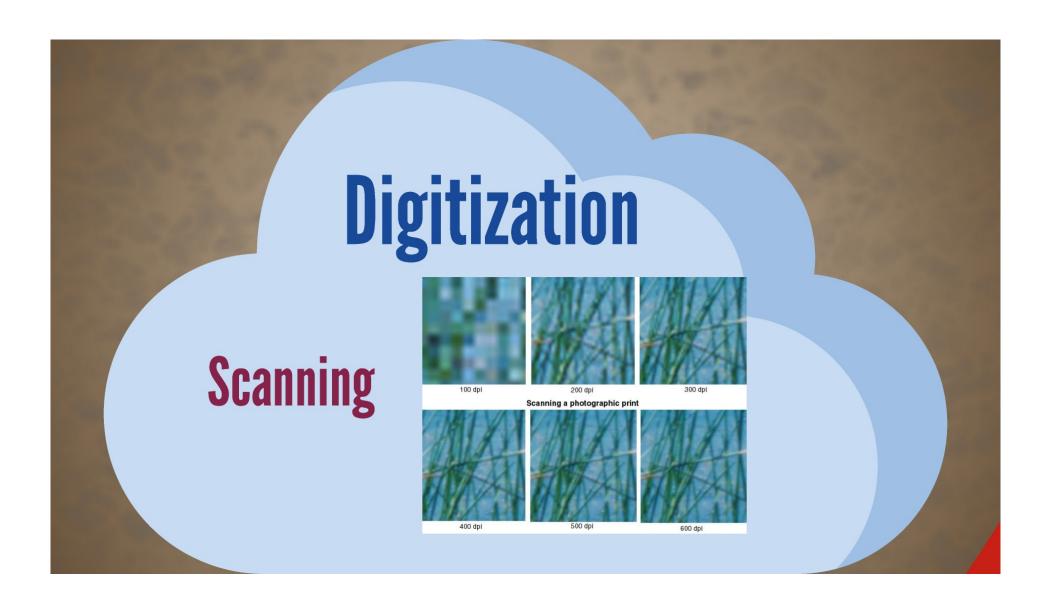

# DPI Recommended Values

Documents, Photos 4"-8"x10" = 300 dpi

Smaller slides: 1800 dpi

If your scanner only offers a choice of quality, always choose "best" or "highest"
